ORDER DONATES TO OLD YORK HISTORICAL SOCIETY

In 2010, the Order of the First Families of Maine contributed \$500 to the Old York Historical Society, doing business as the Museums of Old York. The Society was founded over one hundred years ago to preserve the local history and artifacts relating to residents of York, Maine. As one of the earliest New England settlements, York is distinguished as the nations first chartered city (1641) and the first incorporated city (1642).

Today the Museums of Old York consists of nine historic buildings, each containing a wealth of decorative arts and artifacts, with the buildings themselves serving as items of architectural history. Seven of the nine buildings are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Along with the museum buildings, the Old York Historical Society has an archival library, a 17 acres nature preserve and owns the Harry Winebaum Curatorial Storage and Study Center in York Beach. They also maintain the Snowshoe Rock, a site related to the 1692 Candlemas Raid, as well as the Second Parish Graveyard.

Prominent among the extensive collections of fine art, furniture, family artifacts, tools and other historical items are the Bulman bed hangings. These are considered to be the only complete set of American crewelwork to have survived from the 18th century. Also situated on this property is the Old Gaol, the oldest British public building in existence in the U.S.; the Jeffereds Tavern and the John Hancock Warehouse, the only surviving commercial building from Colonial days and once owned by the famous American patriot.

OFFME is pleased to have given in support of this Maine historical site.

ORDER OF FIRST FAMILIES OF MAINE

Proposed Bylaws Changes To Be Voted On At The 2011 April Meeting

All changes are in:

ARTICLE IV OFFICERS AND DUTIES

SECTION 4. OFFICERS' ELECTION AND NOMINATING COMMITTEE

Current: C. An officer may serve a second term of office in the same position or be elected to another

position within the board for no more than three consecutive terms, with the exception of the

Treasurer General and Registrar General who may serve until their successors are elected.

Proposed: C. "An officer may only serve two terms of office in the same position. An officer may be

elected to another position within the board for any subsequent term."

Rationale: To provide continuity on the board, while preventing "lifetime" terms for some offices.

SECTION 5. OFFICER DUTIES

Current: A. The PRESIDENT GENERAL shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Order, shall

represent the Order officially upon all occasions, shall fill by appointment all vacant offices, and shall appoint all committees and shall be an ex-officio voting member of all committees except the nominating committee. It shall be the duty of the President General to set the date for all meetings, define the style of the meeting, preside at all meetings, and extend all

invitations to membership. The certificates of membership shall be signed by the President

General.

Proposed: Add a paragraph that reads: "In recognition of faithful service to the Order, a President

General, after having served a full term of office, may be elected Honorary President General for life by a majority

voice vote at the Annual Meeting."

Rationale: To provide a way to honor a President General for their service.

SECTION 2. EXECUTIVE BOARD

Current: A. The Executive Board shall consist of all Officers and shall be referred to hereinafter as the

"Board."

Proposed: Add a phrase to read: "The Executive Board shall consist of all Officers and Honorary

Presidents General and shall be referred to hereinafter as the "Board."

Rationale: To provide internal consistency with the change to section 5A.
