- ♦ Clouds Hill, 4157 Post Road, Warwick (4 miles / 20 mins. from hotel; 8 miles / 20 mins. from Smith's Castle)
 - The historic house at Clouds Hill was built as a wedding gift for Elizabeth Ives Slater on her marriage to Alfred Augustus Reed, Jr. In 2000, Clouds Hill opened its doors to offer the public a "portal to the past" an opportunity to experience late nineteenth century life in a home that had never passed out of the original family's stewardship. That stewardship descended through four generations in the hands of the oldest female.



- Mobility: The museum is handicap accessible to the first floor by lift and ramp. The stairs to the second floor are wide with a sturdy banister and a low riser. The grounds are level, partly walking on grass, a little dirt, and pavement. The approach to the carriage museum is up a concrete ramp to a concrete and wooden floor. The Center for the Outdoors is up three steps.
- ♦ Smith's Castle, 55 Richard Smith Dr, North Kingstown (12 miles / 30 mins. from hotel; 8 miles / 20 mins. from Clouds Hill)
 - Along the western shore of the Narragansett Bay in Rhode Island is an area known as Cocumscussoc, which is part of the ancestral homeland of the Narragansett People. Cocumscussoc was also the location of trading posts established by

Roger Williams and Richard Smith in the late 1630s. Nestled among the cattails and holly trees at Cocumscussoc is a handsome house that has existed on the site since 1678, known for centuries as Smith's Castle. <u>A living history encampment is being put in place for us.</u>

• Mobility: We do have a wheelchair ramp to the first floor. There is a second floor only accessible by stairs (with a railing). For those who do not wish to climb stairs, a docent can show photos and explain the second floor.





1:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m.. <u>Daggett House</u>, 825 Armistice Boulevard, Slater Park, Pawtucket (3 miles / 10 mins. from The Guild - Pawtucket; 5 miles / 15 mins. from Blackstone Valley Explorer River Cruise)

The oldest standing house in Pawtucket, furnished with outstanding antiques, including Colonial Pewter used in the Revolutionary War and China owned by General and Mrs. Nathanael Greene and the Daggett Family. Eight generations of Daggetts lived on the farm, now known as Slater Park. The house was leased in 1902 by the Pawtucket Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution who began its restoration.



Mobility: Please know that the Daggett House is not handicap accessible. There are also two steep staircases to access the second floor - no hand rails. We encourage visitors with physical limitations to remain on the first floor. There is also no public rest room. Street parking is available, along with lots behind the Daggett House and across the street at the tennis courts.
